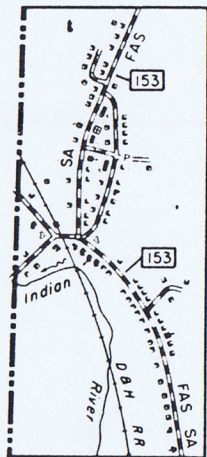
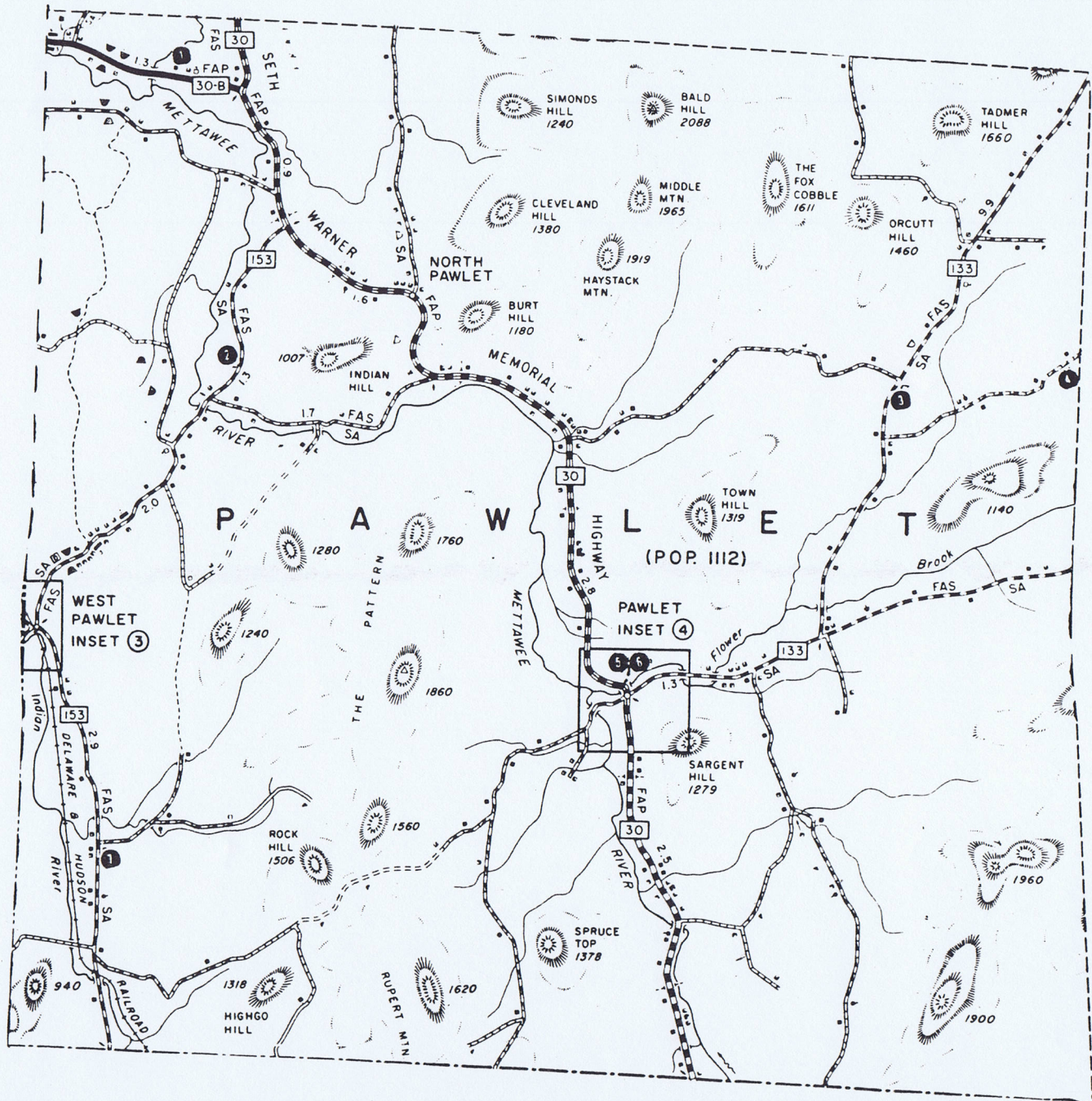

ELIGIBILITY CLAUSE

"Any woman is eligible for membership in the National Society of the Daughters of the American Revolution who is not less than eighteen years of age, and who is descended from a man or woman who, with unflinching loyalty to the cause of American Independence, served as a sailor, or as a soldier or civil officer in one of the several Colonies or States, or in the United Colonies or States, or as a recognized patriot, or rendered material aid thereto; provided the applicant is personally acceptable to the Society." (Constitution, Article III, Section 1.)

ANCESTOR'S SERVICES

The said Micah Vail who resided during the American Revolution at either Huntington, Long Island or Danby, Vermont assisted in establishing American Independence, while acting in the capacity of captain, selectman, representative and judge

My ancestors's services during the Revolutionary War were as follows: Selectman in Danby, Vermont 1775; delegate to convention January 31, 1775; May 4, 1776, member of committee of safety for the town; on committee to take charge of public rights as granted by the charter; representative to the convention in Dorset, September 25, 1776. The 1777 town meeting was held at his home.

"He was associated with Allen, Warner and others in defending the rights of the people during the struggle between New York and New Hampshire, being for several years a member of the committee of safety. He represented Danby in the convention in Dorset in 1776 and which declared the New Hampshire Grants, a free and separate district. He was an intimate friend of Ethan Allen and whose house Allen frequently visited. 'The haughty land jobbers at New York' found in Capt. Vail a strong opponent to their unjust measures with the settlers, a true friend. He and his wife both died with the measles in 1777, the same day and were buried in the same grave. Tradition says that they died from the effects of poison administered to them by a Tory doctor after they had nearly recovered from the measles."

Micah Vail, captain of Green Mountain Boys, 1775, after taking Ticonderoga. Re-elected captain of 6th company of Green Mountain Boys, served in Col. Seth Warner's regiment in expedition to Canada, 1775, taking part in Battles of St. John and Langale and capture of Montreal.

Sixth signer of the Association, July 25, 1776, Dorset Convention. Sixth judge elected at this convention.
